- Internship placement in an American organization, for qualified participants (ages 20-26). Sergey will receive advanced English language enhancement activities, an internship placement, and assistance to complete his "Program/Internship Summary" and American-style resume.

## Summer '99 Language Programs

Albanian student Anisa Nerguti has been on the minds and

hearts of Institute officers and friends for more than a year. Her American English Language Immersion Program in the United States was originally scheduled for August 1998; however, world events intervened and changed the plans for her U.S. stay.

The U.S. Embassy in Tirana, Albania has been closed to the public and on emergency status since summer 1998, when terrorists bombed two American embassies in Africa and caused the closing of six American embassies (including the one in Tirana) worldwide that were considered

to be insufficiently provided with safety

communists and nationalists. Anisa's family suffered for its nationalist support when the communist cause was victorious. Today Albania enjoys political freedom, but its stability is threatened by economic and political conflicts dating back many generations.

Anisa is 18 years old. She lives in Tirana with her parents and her brother. She excels in English, and also loves Math and Physics. Anisa speaks French, English and Albanian, and is considering a career in information systems. Her teachers place her in the top

measures. The closing of the embassy was followed by violent hostilities in the civil war in Kosovo, a Serbian province; these hostilities spilled over into Albania and prevented the reopening of the Embassy, making it very difficult for Anisa to get a U.S. visa.

Albania is situated north of Greece, west of Macedonia and south of Montenegro; the population is 3.3 million and has a republican governmental structure. Now free of communist oppression and a member of the U.N, Albania was the
