With their spectacular canyons and impressive forests, these lands have been inhabited by the Natives for centuries and still retain much of their wild and untamed power. Using as a basis the first "American West" Travel-and-Learn" program in 1991, which took participants to Colorado, Montana and Wyoming, the Institute has planned a full-scale "Jewels of the American West" program for May 2009.

Participants will arrive by air in the designated airport (most likely Denver, Colorado). The specific itinerary is still flexible at this point and will be developed in accord with participants' choices of options.

The American West is blessed with an unparalleled number of magnificent natural parks and monuments. Parks to be visited, in addition to those mentioned above, may include the Grand Tetons, Dinosaur National Monument, Mesa Verde, Bryce Canyon, Canyonlands, Arches, Zion, the Black Canyon of the Gunnison, and Glen Canyon.

All of these areas provide breathtaking scenery, intriguing historical importance and the opportunity for outdoor recreation such as hiking, canoeing and camping.

Program Dates

The working dates are May 4-24, but are still to be confirmed, within the next two months. Earlier and later arrivals and departures may be arranged with the Institute's assistance.

Program Costs

The Institute is beginning the logistical preparations for this "Travel-and-Learn" program. As in all "Travel-and-Learn" programs, I will personally accompany the group as Program Director during

the entire program, providing an historical, geographical, economic and social commentary on the areas we visit.

To accommodate the various requirements and wishes of the program participants, the Institute will coordinate the logistical arrangements in the US: ground transportation, accommodations, meals and sightseeing visits for the participants. The Institute will charge a base flat fee of \$500.00 per participant to cover the Program Director's services and these logistical arrangements.

As the participants will have several options as to all the logistical arrangements, each person will cover his or her own expenses for the transportation and accommodation arrangements he or she chooses, including airfare to and

All incidental expenses, including meals, souvenirs, postage, phone usage and photography, will be paid by the participant.
