National Cathedral, Christ the Redeemer Church in Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida. Jarda was already ordained as a deacon in 2005; his new office, presbyter, carries more responsibility and will allow him to enlarge the scope of his ministry activities, both in the US and in the Czech Republic. We are most grateful to the CCC for having confidence in Jarda's calling and embracing him into membership in its clergy.
